Changes to services in Waukesha County

WAUKESHA — Changes to Waukesha County services, in response to COVID-19, were announced Tuesday, including functional changes at the Waukesha County Courthouse and changes to operations at the Waukesha County Administration Center.

Screening processes will now include a series of three questions related to COVID-19 when visitors are seeking entry at the courthouse.

There is a temporary suspension of in-person proceedings with limited exceptions through May 22. All civil and criminal jury trials, traffic calendars for citations, scheduled to begin

before May 22, are canceled and will be rescheduled.

Juvenile and probate court operations and hearings will be relocated to the main courthouse beginning today. Jury services scheduled from March 16 through May 22 are limited to emergencies only.

The Waukesha County Administration Center will be closed to the public beginning today. Services are relocated to room C112 at the Waukesha County Courthouse. Visitors should check with individual departments on if walk-in reservations are available.

Waukesha County Health and Human Services will be open from 7:45 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday and public services will not be provided after the build-

ing closes at 4:30 p.m.

The Waukesha County parks, trails, golf courses and dog exercise areas are open and still in compliance with the Safer at Home order.
