Water utility to hold open houses at Waukesha high schools

WAUKESHA — The Waukesha Water Utility announced three open houses that will be held at three high schools in the city next week. The meetings are open to the public and will be the first since Waukesha officials announced their partnership with Milwaukee for water late last month.

Attendees can ask questions about the latest updates to the water supply project, including the contract between Milwaukee and Waukesha that gained approval from committees in both cities and will next be discussed by full Common Councils on Nov. 28 in Milwaukee and Dec. 5 in Waukesha.

Waukesha Water Utility General Manager Dan Duchniak will be at next week's meetings to answer questions and members of the Great Water Alliance team that had been working on bringing the public up to

speed with the water deal will offer a presentation and in-depth displays, according to a press release.

Though a pipeline route hasn't been set, Waukesha residents can ask questions about the water contract with Milwaukee, the \$286.2 million water project and water rates, which are still expected to double or triple in coming years.
